Introducing UUSC Justice-Building


- Six month study of how to better serve our constituents.


 UUSC is ideally positioned to help if we support our constituents in justice-building regardless of the issue they choose.




The Virtuous Circle of Social Change

- Administering congregational fundraising & membership.
- Supporting the Volunteer Network in that work.

Justice-Building Program Key Components:

For individuals:

- A wider portfolio of graduated volunteer roles and experiences easy & short-term to professionalized & ongoing.
- More compelling campaigns to join in.
- Roles, experiences, campaigns that attract young adults: online + direct engagement.



Justice-Building Program Key Components:

For congregations:

- More hands-on learning-acting campaigns and events (e.g. Guest at Your Table).
- Pilot several viable models of "on-staff" social justice leadership in congregations.
- Develop structured, self-guided support system for congregations that want to do more effective social change.



The New Justice-Building Program

- Will be led by Pam Sparr, Associate Director, Justice-Building
- Two new Senior Program Leader positions:
 - Senior Program Leader for Activism
 - Senior Program Leader for Justice-Building
- Two new Volunteer Roles to Start
 - Congregational Membership and Events Liaison
 - Justice-Building Innovator



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Justice-Building Innovator

- Select position; application process includes ministerial reference
- Up to 3 years
- Work with one or more congregations to develop their skills, focus, grounding, game plan, organizing efforts (advance with them along social justice trajectory)
- Help pilot UUSC programs, projects, campaigning
- Innovators receive ongoing training and staff support networked with each other
- Possible stipend



Congregational Membership & Events Liaison

- Application process includes ministerial reference
- 3 year term possibly renewable
- Organizer/Educator/Salesperson
- 2-way communications hub
- Provide regular feedback and information; identify opportunities
- In charge of organizing volunteers to implement UUSC programs such as Guest at Your Table, Justice Sunday and others to be developed




