### Why Climate Justice?

- Climate change is the single largest threat to both planet and justice and effects everyone on the planet.
- UU's have been early to speak out, slower to act collectively.
- The next two years are the critical window to:
  - Build moral conviction.
  - Change state, local, international policy.
  - Initiate bold action.
- We have an essential contribution to make
  - Getting past fact debates to spark moral imagination.
  - Using our interfaith fluency to demonstrate
     "Many Faiths, One Earth."
- This is the most urgent concern of the next generations.



## Why Collaborate?



- A challenge to all life and every person on the planet
  - ... that can **only** be solved through collective action.
- An opportunity to **unite** humanity against a common threat
  - ... and enhance **significance** and **meaning** by balancing individualism and interdependence.
- A moment that calls us as UU's to **amplify** our collective voice and **accelerate** collective action.

### How to (and how not to) do collaboration

- Size of group
- Covenant of relationship
- Negotiating organizational cultures
- Communication X10
- Honesty about capacity
- Lead toward energy, not authority.
