We need the ICJ judges to understand the very real consequences of their actions and power they hold. We need the judges to protect present and future generations.

We need them to hear our stories and messages.

The stories will be primarily located on our website, which launched on September 17th.

At the bottom of the landing page, you can find the section "stories" which contains a Social Wall, enabling us to collect videos that have been uploaded to Instagram and other Social platforms.

They may be also used for social media advocacy, public screenings, and displays at the Peace Palace (seat of the ICJ) and other exhibitions as part of the ClimatelCJAO Campaign.

This is a growing database, consisting of climate change user generated videos from all over the world.

#### HOW TO PARTICIPATE?

Record short video testimonies of either yourself or others. Share your experiences of the climate crisis and its impact on your life, family, friends, and community.

Even if you haven't faced it directly, you can still share your hopes and fears, and stand in solidarity with those who are living through it.

Every voice counts in the fight for climate justice!

### NOTES TO TAKE IN WHEN DRAFTING YOUR STORY OR MESSAGE

The Witness Stand Script follows a specific structure.


Each story or message shouldn't be longer than 5mins.

The aim of the video is to directly address the judges of the ICJ and convey your message and demand to them.

- 1. Intro: "Dear Judges of the International Court of Justice, my name is x, I am a x and come from x. As per the examples, this is also an opportunity to speak in your mother tongue, too.
- 2. Main Statement: Examples of how the climate crisis is affecting you/country/community or what you are doing to fight it (These are questions for your inspiration: When and how did you first experience climate change? Who are you fighting for? How is climate change affecting your communities? What gives you hope in the fight for climate justice? What is the most surprising thing for you about climate change? How are you working to protect your community or fight for climate justice?).
- 3. Outro: "Dear Judges, answer our call to action" or a bespoke final statement. For instance most witnesses end their statement with the question: "Dear judges, will you hear my call?"



Make sure you use the Hashtag #ClimateWitness and #WitnessStand in your captions when you upload the video to your socials, which allows us to integrate your video into the Social Wall on our website.



#### NOTES ON CAMERA SET-UP

The user-generated content which will be collected on the Social Wall of the website aims to make the Witness Stand more accessible and inspire more people to share their climate messages and stories.

That means, we want you to feel comfortable and let your message or story be as authentic as possible - there are no strict rules on how to film or how your video should look like, simply ensure the camera is steady and has minimal background noise.


#### Here are some suggestions:




- The picture format is Portrait 9:16 (1080 x 1920 Pixel (px), please keep that in mind!
- Look straight into the camera and try to edit as little as possible, to convey one coherent and authentic message.
- Try to avoid interference noise like music, children playing, birds singing (too loudly), airplanes, ventilators, speak as clearly as possible.
- Avoid backlight by facing the light, be conscious of shadows.
